Fossil	The remains of plants or animals that lived long ago.
Herbivore	An animal that only eats plants.
Carnivore	An animal that only eats meat.
Tyrannosaurus rex	One of the largest and fearsome carnivores of all time.
Pterodactyl	A flying dinosaur.
Stegosaurus	A dinosaur with plates down its spine.
Diplodocus	A long-necked, long-tailed dinosaur.

Did humans exist with dinosaurs?	What would the world be like today if dinosaurs were on our planet?!
What did dinosaurs sound like?	Do you think a dinosaur made any noises? What do you think it sounded like? Possible suggestions: - <i>Bellows Honks Moos Squeeks Roars Grunts Hisses</i>
Were all dinosaurs big?	Were all dinosaurs big? How big do you think they were? Did you know that some dinosaurs were the size of a chicken?
